Transcultural Understanding

This seminar draws critical theory into conversation with historicized, site-specific case studies of improvisative practices across cultures and communities. We will attend to the nuances of specific musical and cultural practices by attending to how they relate within and between the communities in which they exist. Performativity theory is the theoretical bedrock of the seminar. If improvisation can forecast better ways of being-in-the-world, it can also enact dystopian disaster. We will explore materials ranging from Nor-tec to the Asian Pacific Performance Exchange, and from Asian American improvisation to testimonial theater. Readings are from cultural studies, Ethnic Studies, musicology, ethnomusicology, popular music studies, and performance studies.
